Delta Dental Foundation Awards \$5,000 Smiles for Kids Grant to Guilford County Public Health

Greensboro, NC (May 3, 2018) – The Guilford County Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health Division received a \$5,000 Smiles for Kids grant from the <u>Delta Dental Foundation</u> (DDF) to advance the oral health of uninsured and underinsured children in Guilford County through their *Project Access Dental* (PAD) Program. This grant will assist the program in securing treatment for children who, through in-school dental screenings, have been identified with urgent dental care needs and an inability to pay.

Project Access Dental reaches approximately 5,200 kindergarten students in Guilford County Schools' 69 elementary schools. The Guilford County Department of Health and Human Services Dental Clinic in turn becomes the "dental home" for many children who have Medicaid or are uninsured.

"The grant from the Delta Dental Foudation is a great help in getting the students in our PAD program the care they need," said Debbie Kennedy, Guilford County Public Health's School Health Dental Hygienist. "Once the student goes to the dentist through our program and is no longer in pain, the parents begin to see the dentist as a partner in keeping their child's teeth healthy, which contributes to keeping the rest of their body healthy."

The Delta Dental Foundation focuses on ensuring children and adults in North Carolina receive premiere oral health education and high-quality dental care. The grant received by Guilford County Public Health is one of 19 grants totaling \$65,800 awarded in 2018 to North Carolina oral health organizations and programs. This is the fourth year that the Guilford County Department of Public Health has been awarded a Smiles for Kids grant. Grant recipients were selected based on criteria that included the number of at-risk children served, the uniqueness of the program, the level of community involvement and the ability to measure results.

"The Delta Dental Foundation is committed to promoting good oral health habits and providing better access to quality dental care for those who are underserved in our state," said Curt Ladig, president and CEO of Delta Dental of North Carolina. "Supporting the work of the Guilford County Department of Public Health can help ensure that more children receive the care they need and are educated about the importance of good oral health to grow up healthy and be successful in school and in life."

About Guilford County Public Health

The Department's dental clinic provides services such as exams, limited emergency visits, cleanings and sealants. They see children up to age 21 with Medicaid or NC Health Choice; children who have applied for Medicaid or NC Health Choice, but were declined, whose parents can pay a reduced fee at time of service; and pregnant women with a pink Medicaid card.
