Delta Dental Foundation Awards \$2,000 Smiles for Kids Grant to America's ToothFairy to Improve Oral Health Education in North Carolina

Charlotte, NC (May 20, 2019) America's ToothFairy, also known as the National Children's Oral Health Foundation (NCOHF), received a \$2,000 Smiles for Kids grant from the <u>Delta Dental Foundation</u> (DDF) to support their Oral Health HERO program by assisting with volunteer engagement and training.

The HERO program focuses on four areas: Health, Education, Resources, and Outreach. The program positions volunteers as "community superheroes" that are equipped with educational resources to train teachers to educate North Carolina children and families about oral health. Volunteers will also lead Smile Drives to collect oral care products to provide to families in need. The goal is to reinforce the link between oral and overall systemic health and to promote positive oral health behaviors.

"Preventing dental disease begins with education," said Jill Malmgren, Executive Director of America's ToothFairy. "Thanks to the Delta Dental Foundation's support, community volunteers will be equipped with critical resources and training to educate children and their caregivers and promote positive oral health behaviors in their communities."

The Delta Dental Foundation focuses on ensuring that children and adults in North Carolina receive high quality oral health education and dental care. The grant received by America's ToothFairy is one of 19 grants totaling \$70,000 that DDF is donating to North Carolina oral health organizations and programs in 2019. This is the second year that America's ToothFairy has been awarded a Smiles for Kids grant. Grant recipients were selected based on criteria that included the number of at-risk children served, the uniqueness of the program, the level of community involvement in the program and the ability to measure results.

"The Delta Dental Foundation is committed to promoting good oral health habits and providing better access to quality dental care for those who are underserved in our state," said Curt Ladig, president and CEO of Delta Dental of North Carolina. "Supporting the work of America's ToothFairy can help ensure that more children are educated about the importance of good oral health and receive the care they need to grow up healthy and be successful in school and in life."
